

Important things to know about your new kitten:

- Your kitten is microchipped and the **microchip** will automatically register to you for **FREE**, forever.
- You will receive an email from 24PetWatch within the next few days that will have a link to create an
 account so that you can update your information as needed or change your kitten's name. We are
 always listed as a back up contact should your kitten get lost/found.
- Your kitten is spayed or neutered. If that was done recently, monitor their incision for swelling or redness and restrict their activity. Please give us a call if you have any concerns. (916-705-6884)
- You will receive two emails from Shelterluv with your kittens information. Check your spam if you
 don't see them.
- The first email's subject line will say "Congratulations on your new family member!"
- Your kitten's next vaccine may be due soon! These records will tell you when the next vaccine is
 due. Schedule an appointment with your vet ASAP.
- IBR kittens must be indoor only
- Give your kitten time to adjust; its best to keep them contained to a bathroom or spare room for the first few days. This room should have a spot for food, water, litter box, bed, and toys.
- Unless otherwise stated, your new kitten should be free fed kibble and water.
- Your kitten should stay on kitten food until at least 1 year old.
- All kittens are adopted out **healthy** to the best of our knowledge. However, sometimes the **stress** of adoption can bring out an **underlying sickness** that was not present prior to adoption.
- Common stress related illnesses in cats include diarrhea and Upper Respiratory Infections. (See the hand out of feline herpesvirus)
- Some of our favorite supplements for strengthening their immune systems include probiotics such as **Fortiflora** or **Proviable** and Lysine such as **Viralys Lysine Powder**.
- We are not veterinarians. If your kitten is having an emergency please go to your closest ER Vet.
